#### The Structure of The UK Methodist Church Part One

The Methodist Church of Great Britain is still organised in a methodical way using many of the structures introduced by its founder, John Wesley. However, the Church is quite pragmatic, and is willing to make changes where they seem desirable.

Structures are there to enable decision making that takes account of all concerns and views within the Church. No one is given supreme

authority – consultation is vital. At the same time, churches cannot simply arrange their own affairs, but have some shared disciplines and ways of working.

The Methodist Church has a number of levels in its national structure, which are:

- Church
- Circuit
- District
- Connexion and Methodist Conference

I want to briefly consider each of these so that all of us in Burnley and Pendle Methodist Circuit have a better understanding of our church and how it works. To save information overload, these will be split over three weeks of the Circuit Newsletter.

### The Structure of The UK Methodist Church Part 1 – Church and Circuit

#### Church

The Local Methodist Church is the part of Methodism most Methodist members and adherents are familiar with. Methodists are members of their Local Church, still technically called Societies. All members should have a Pastoral Visitor allocated to them. It is in the Local Church that worship takes place, usually on a Sunday, with services led by a Minister, Local Preacher or Worship Leader. Through the Church Council, Local Churches manage their own affairs (including church property and finance) through elected volunteers who hold office within the local church, like Stewards, Treasurer and Safeguarding Officer. Local Churches are responsible for raising the money they need to operate, primarily through congregational offerings but increasingly through

fund raising events and property letting. The primary call on Church Funds is the Circuit Assessment which is set annually by the Circuit.

### Circuit

The circuit is a group of churches served by one or more Ministers. A Minister will have pastoral charge of one or more churches, but will preach and lead worship in different local churches in the circuit, along with Local Preachers. The arrangements for leading worship in a circuit are drawn up in a quarterly plan.

The Circuit is led by the Superintendent Minister who presides over the circuit staff (both lay and ordained) and the Circuit Meeting, and with lay and ordained colleagues facilitates and encourages mission throughout the Circuit. He or she is also responsible for drawing up the plan and arranging the gathering of information about activities (eg baptisms, weddings, and funerals) and about membership statistics in the circuit.

The Circuit Meeting is the primary decision-making body and its membership includes representatives from every Circuit Church as well as Circuit Ministers, Circuit Stewards, Supernumerary Ministers stationed in the Circuit and other ex-officio members as detailed in CPD. The Circuit Meeting is Chaired by the Superintendent Minister. Responsibility for the direction and policy for the Circuit is shared between lay and ordained. Voluntary Circuit Stewards have responsibility for maintaining, buying and selling circuit property (usually manses), and for the general welfare of the ordained and employed staff in the circuit. Circuit Stewards, together with the Ministers appointed to the Circuit, are responsible for the spiritual and material wellbeing of the Circuit, and for upholding ad acting upon he decisions of the Circuit Meeting. The circuit is the place where new initiatives and changes in the pattern of church life need to happen. This is where the staffing capacity is decided, where closures of chapels are debated, and where fresh expressions of church or new pioneer ministries are launched.

The Circuit is funded through the Circuit Assessment paid by all Local Churches and through rentals on any Manses not currently occupied by a Minister.

David's solo output includes a range of congregational praise and worship songs, acoustic roots music and instrumental pieces.


## Our preacher for the morning will be Pete Baker from Life Church, Burnley.
