



Dear Friends.

The 1st of September marks the first day of the Methodist Connexional Year and the start of my last year as the superintendent minister in Burnley and Pendle Circuit.

It also marks the first year for quite a few years that Christvin Edbarg and his family are not part of our wider Circuit family. Please join me in praying for them as Christvin begins his ministry as a probationer minister on the Isle of Man.

This time next year I will be starting ministry in a new Circuit. I did initially seek reinvitation, but God spoke to me through that process and made it clear that it is time for change; change for me personally as Sue and I will be living in a new place and getting to know new people, which is always exciting, and change for Burnley & Pendle Methodist Circuit as you get to know a new Superintendent.

This, of course, means that for the next few months I will personally be involved in Stationing and will, at times, have to concentrate on that. Similarly, the Circuit will be on the stationing process seeking my successor which will mark a very busy time for members of the Circuit Invitations Committee and, in particular, the Circuit Stewards. Please pray for me that I will be matched with a Circuit where I can use my particular gifts and graces; and for the Circuit that we will find the right Superintendent to come here next summer. Times of change are always unnerving, but whilst our God is unchanging, our God is also a God who wants to see us change and grow as individual Christian people and as a Circuit. I will do the best I am capable of this coming year as your Circuit Superintendent to serve the Circuit and its people. You will have my best efforts as you have had them since September 2021 as I continue to work collaboratively in leadership with the Circuit Staff and Stewards to undertake the ever-changing ministry God has given us to do in this place.
